## From the Director...

Dear Parents and Students,

I am delighted to inform our community that the school's report for the upcoming CIS/WASC/IB accreditation/evaluation visit was completed and sent to the various agents on Tuesday 10 March. As you are aware this was a pilot study for these three agencies, the first time (anywhere) that all three IB programmes have had a seamless and simultaneous 5-year visit with both CIS and WASC.

A number of key benefits will accrue from the visit (19-22 April), including:

- ✓ Formal affirmation of the many wonderful things that our school is doing
- ✓ The provision of principal areas in need of strengthening to make our programmes even better
- ✓ Extension of current CIS and WASC accreditation for another 5 years
- ✓ Full re-evaluation of all three IB programmes
- ✓ Alignment of both accreditation and all 3 IB evaluation cycles into the same year

The team will start arriving on Sunday 18 April and will convene officially on Monday the 19<sup>th</sup>. The visit proper will commence on Tuesday the 20<sup>th</sup>.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all of the board members, students, staff and parents who contributed to the preparation of this report, and in particular to thank Bill Elman for the enormous amount of time and effort that he put into leading and coordinating the entire process. ## The day when Ms. Yang came to visit our school !

On February 3<sup>rd</sup> Ms. Yang, a Chinese animal protector came to our school to tell our community and service group about the life of an animal protector. The students of our community and service group learned many things such as ways to protect animals and also how hard it is to protect animals.

Everyone in our community and service group was shocked when we heard about how hard it was to protect animals. Ms. Yang had made very many sacrifices just to protect animals. One of the many things that she sacrificed is the 2 apartments that she sold to raise money towards protecting animals. She had sold everything except the 2 earrings that she had on the day. However, even after sacrificing this much for animals she had a depth of over five hundred thousand RMB. Also she is spending about 10,000 RMB each month to look after 560 abandoned cats and dogs.

After she told us about how hard protecting animals are I personally thought why she would do all these things to protect animals just because she rescued a drowning cat in the river in 1998. Next she told us about the conditions of animals that were being protected in the protection agency. She told us again about a very shocking thing that many of the animals that were being protected didn't have a leg or an eye. After I heard about the condition of animals that were being protected I found the answer to the question I asked myself.

The students in our community and service group looked for ways that we can do to help Ms. Yang. We came up with several ideas such as to make a donation box and having a bake sale to raise money. Our community and service group will held a bake sale at cafeteria on 18 Thursday and 19 Friday March. I really want to tell people to help us raise money for Ms. Yang.
