THE INTERNATIONAL<sup>IST</sup> IST Yearbook takes it's core design from the theme of the Chinese Zodiac and incorporates this with the fundamental principles and values at the heart of IST. WORKING. LEARNING. ACTING TOGETHER

Much of Chinese philosophy is built around the belief in the five elements and their abilities to interact with and create relationships between natural phenomena. The five elements have been part of Chinese culture almost from the beginning. Interestingly, few people outside the Asian world understand the importance of the five elements, especially how each relates to the workings of the Chinese Zodiac.

The five elements of wood, fire, earth, metal and water are associated with five major planets in the Solar System: Jupiter Mars, Saturn, Venus and Mercury. The five elements are naturally-occurring phenomena and they're believed to have both a generating and an overcoming influence on one another. For example, wood generates fire, water generates wood, water overcomes fire, fire overcomes metal, etc.

Along with these generating and overcoming forces, the five elements of the Chinese Zodiac are also correlated with direction, color season, body parts, tastes, and senses. Wood, for example correlates to the direction East, the season of Spring, the color blue or green, the taste of sourness, the sense of sight, and the body parts gall bladder liver and ring finger. The other four elements likewise have their own correlations.

The characteristics of the five elements, metal, wood, fire, water and earth, impact the twelve animals of the Chinese Zodiac by assigning different characteristics to the animals. Since the twelve animals of the Chinese Zodiac actually represent a period of time, in this case a year (the 12 branches), assigning one of the five elements to each of the twelve years (12 branches) actually creates 60 different combinations. Rather than operating in 12-year cycles, the Chinese Zodiac is actually based on a system of 60-year cycles.

Do you know what cycle-year we're in now? There's a Twitching Clue on the facing page...




### Twitching!!














BOTH GRADE 9 AND GRADE 10 CLASSES EXPLORED LABAN'S MOVEMENT THEORY, APPLYING THIS THEORY TO A RANGE OF MUSIC AND

STORYTELLING BEFORE CHANNELING THESE NEW SKILLS INTO A PERFORMANCE OF "WHAT THEY TOOK WITH THEM" BY JENIFER TOKSVIG, A POEM ABOUT REFUGEES ESCAPING CRISIS. THIS TIMELY PERFORMANCE ALIGNED WITH A GLOBAL TRAGEDY AND GAVE US THE OPPOR-

TUNITY TO EXPLORE THE POWER OF PERFORMANCE ART IN SHARING MESSAGES WITH THE WORLD.

WE MOVED ON TO WORK WITH SHORT, SCRIPTED VIGNETTES, WORKING IN THE REALMS OF CONSTANTIN STANISLAVSKI AND HIS "METHOD ACTING." THE STUDENTS WERE CHALLENGED WITH VERY SHORT, OPEN-ENDED SCRIPTS THAT COULD HAVE BEEN APPLIED TO A HUNDRED

DIFFERENT CHARACTERS AND SITUATIONS. AFTER MAKING SENSE OF THESE, THEY HAD TO DEVELOP DETAILED UNDERSTANDING OF THEIR CHARACTERS AND HOW TO BEST PORTRAY THESE RELATIONSHIPS IN SUCH A SHORT, SCRIPTED WORK.

GRADE 9 TOOK ON THE WORLD OF SELF-DEVISED ITALIAN MASKED COMEDY – COMMEDIA DEL' ARTE – AS THEIR FINAL UNIT. EXPLORING THE CRAZY WORLD OF MAGNIFICOS, OF MASTERS, AND SERVANTS AND, OF ZANNI'S, OF PHYSICAL COMEDY AND ASKING THEMSELVES; CAN WE LEARN TO BE FUNNY? THIS TIME THE SCRIPTS WERE REMOVED COMPLETELY, AND STUDENTS HAD TO COME UP WITH THEIR OWN SHORT SCENES, SHOWING CHARACTER RELATIONSHIPS AND PHYSICALITY WITH ACCURACY AND OF COURSE...WHILST BEING FUNNY. GRADE 10 TOOK A DIVE INTO THE WORLD OF GREEK THEATRE. EXPLORING SOME OF THE OLDEST REMAINING SCRIPTS IN THE WESTERN WORLD – ANTIGONE BY SOPHOCLES. WE ASKED OURSELVES "WHERE DOES THE MODERN-DAY MUSICAL THEATRE CHORUS COME FROM?", AND "WHAT IS THE ROLE OF THE CHORUS" FOR THE CLASSIC GREEK AUDIENCE? STUDENTS MADE USE OF THEIR SKILLS FROM THE PREVIOUS UNITS TO DEVELOP PERFORMANCES FROM THIS CLASSIC GREEK TRAGEDY.

IT HAS BEEN A LOT OF ADVENTURE, AND LAUGHTER AND SORE LEG MUSCLES (ASK GRADE 9) BUT WE MADE IT TO THE END OF THE YEAR WITH SMILES AND MEMORIES. IT HAS BEEN AN EXCITING YEAR AND TOGETHER WE ARE PLANTING SEEDS FOR TOMORROW.







BOTH 2-D AND 3-D ART ARE CREATED THROUGH DRAWING, PAINTING, PRINTMAKING, TEXTILES, CLAY AND PAPIER-MACHE. AFTER LEARNING A TECHNIQUE OR SKILL, STUDENTS ARE ENCOURAGED TO DEVELOP THEIR OWN ARTISTIC VISION USING THEIR NEWFOUND KNOWLEDGE. STUDENTS HAVE OPPORTUNITIES TO WORK INDEPENDENTLY, AS WELL AS IN GROUPS; ART HISTORY IS EXPLORED THROUGH SLIDE PRESENTATIONS AND DISCUSSION, VIDEO, BOOKS, AND ONLINE GAMES. PRE- AND POST-ASSESSMENTS ARE USED TO ASCERTAIN PRIOR KNOWLEDGE AND CHART GROWTH. STUDENTS LEARN THE CORRECT VOCABULARY WHEN DISCUSSING ART AND ALL PROJECTS END WITH A REFLECTION POSTED TO SEESAW.






























































































GRADE 7 HAVE BEEN WORKING IN A VARIETY OF MEDIA FOR THEIR UNIT; 'ART THROUGH THE ELEMENTS'. THEY HAVE COMPLETED A SUMMATIVE ARTWORK FOR EACH ELEMENT, WORKING IN CERAMICS, PEN AND INK, MOD-ROC BANDAGE AND ACRYLIC PAINT. THEY HAVE ALSO BEEN INVESTIGATING A WIDE RANGE OF ARTWORKS BY ARTISTS INCLUDING; KATE KOLLOWITZ, BRUNO CATALANO AND FRANK AUERBACH.

GRADE 8 HAVE BEEN INVESTIGATING THEMSELVES, THROUGH THE 'PORTRAITS AND IDENTITY' UNIT. THEY CREATED VIDEOS AND PRESENTATIONS BASED ON THEIR OWN CULTURAL IDENTITY TO THE CLASS. THEY ALSO BUILT UP PORTRAITURE SKILLS, SUCH AS PROPORTIONS OF THE FACE, DETAILS OF FACIAL FEATURES AND DEVELOPED REDUCTION PRINT SKILLS AND TECHNIQUES TO CREATE THEIR SUMMATIVE PORTRAIT. THE STUDENTS WERE INFLUENCED BY A RANGE OF PORTRAIT ARTISTS INCLUDING; MARK QUINN AND FRIDA KAHLO AND SHIN KWANGHO.

GRADE 9 HAVE BEEN INVESTIGATING 'STREET ART AND THE LANGUAGE OF GRAFFITI' AS WELL AS A UNIT IN THE MEDIUM OF 'CERAMICS'. THE STUDENTS HAVE BEEN INTRODUCED TO A RANGE OF ARTISTS INCLUDING; BANKSY, KEITH HARING, YOMIKO GOTO AND SABRI BEN ARCHOUR. THE SUMMATIVE ARTWORKS FOR CERAMICS WERE INFLUENCED BY THEIR OWN PHOTOGRAPHS OF NATURE AND USED A TECHNIQUE OF THEIR OWN CHOICE.

GRADE 10 WERE INTRODUCED TO THE GENRE OF 'BATIK' WHERE THEY EXPLORED A RANGE OF TRADITIONAL AND CONTEMPORARY PATTERNS AND MOTIFS WHILST INVESTIGATING THEIR MEANING. THE SECOND UNIT WAS BASED ON THE MEDIUM OF PRINT, THE STUDENTS' SUMMATIVE ASSESSMENT WAS TO CREATE A PRINT WHICH PROMOTED AN IMPORTANT MESSAGE TO AN AUDIENCE. SHEPARD FAIREY, ELIZABETH CATLETT AND KATUSHIKA HOKUSAI WERE INSPIRATION FOR THE STUDENTS' OWN ARTMAKING.

GRADE 11 ARE WELL UNDERWAY WITH THE VISUAL ARTS DIPLOMA COURSE, THEY HAVE BEEN EXPERIMENTING IN A WIDE RANGE OF MEDIA FOR THE FIRST UNIT OF WORK AND HAVE NOW CHOSEN THEIR OWN AREA TO INVESTIGATE. AS WELL AS A SOLID START OF THE COMPARATIVE STUDY, PUTTING THEM IN GOOD STEAD FOR THE FINAL YEAR.

GRADE 12 COMPLETED ALL 3 COMPONENTS OF THE IBDP VISUAL ARTS COURSE. IT WAS A HUGE EFFORT AND AN ENORMOUS AMOUNT OF WORK. THE DP EXHIBITION WAS FINISHED TO AN EXCELLENT STANDARD. THEY SHOULD BE SO PROUD OF EVERYTHING THEY HAVE ACHIEVED AND I WISH THEM ALL THE VERY BEST OF LUCK IN THEIR NEXT VENTURE.





THIS YEAR, THE LITERACY LAB SUCCESSFULLY COPED WITH THE DIFFICULT SITUATION OF THE COVID LOCKDOWN BY RUNNING AN ONLINE MODEL WITH THE SUPPORT OF MANAGERS AND COACHES.













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
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# ELEMENTARY PRINCIPAL

I will be going outside in the world, most likely somewhere in the Netherlands or Australia. Maybe I would have a more certain answer by the time you are reading this in the Yearbook.



I am the 2023 graduate, most likely to become the strongest and most muscular man my bloodline has ever had, and my future daughter's boyfriend will be intimidated







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
