Dear Parents

Last week I shared the exciting news that IST has once again been placed in the highest echelon of both State and international schools offering the IB Diploma, with IB global ranking tables listing IST in the elite 'Top 100' IB Schools World-wide (out of 3000+), and the 'Top 10' IB Schools in China (out of 159). Several members of our community have asked if we were given an exact ranking, to which the answer is yes. IST was placed at #68 in the World (Top 2%, or 98th Percentile) and #7 in China (Top 4%, or 96th Percentile). That our students continue to perform so well really is a terrific acknowledgement of their scholarship, and of the benefits of an IST education, especially when one considers that just as with our general admissions, **IST is non-selective** in offering the IB Diploma to all students rather than just those that we feel will get top scores (quite common in other schools, who may offer alternative pathways to students not anticipated to do so well, including AP courses, A Levels, or school-based high school diplomas).

In actuality, I feel an even greater accolade should be given for IB Diploma pass rates (as opposed to highest averages), where at IST we pride ourselves on supporting all learners towards their highest level of achievement —even though this comes at the risk of lowering our average scores and global ranking— and ultimately to acceptances at a best fit university of their choice. So, while IST has scored exceptionally well these past several years in terms of global ranking, I think it equally important to highlight the fact that **over the past 5 years we have maintained a 100% IB Diploma pass rate** (and 99% over the school's history). This is something about which we should feel very proud indeed.

One additional and revealing statistic, is the fact that attendance data shows that **on average IST students earn an additional 2 points (+4.5%) towards their IB Diploma scores (out of 45 points) for every five years that they spend at IST prior to commencing their IB Diploma (i.e., up to Grade 10). So a student who starts at IST in Grade 5/6 will, on average, earn 2 points more than a student who arrives at IST in Grades 10/11. Even more impressive, and an important indicator of the long-**

term value of our elementary programme, students who start at IST in KG3/Grade 1 (or

lower) earn on average 4 points more, or a 9% improvement!

It is not uncommon for some of us to hold rather tight to traditional definitions and perceptions about academic rigor, including the need to frontload more and more academic content during the elementary school years, including through additional homework. However, to the contrary, it is well accepted that what

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has traditionally worked for university preparation and university (i.e., high levels of content rigor) should not define what is best for younger learners, where a love of learning and learning how to learn are broadly more important factors impacting later learning success than simply trying to make more work, harder, and earlier. And of course, with the advent of AI, content knowledge alone will continue to diminish in importance relative to the digital/AI literacy, emotional intelligence, critical thinking, creativity, and self-management skills that will define the future world of work.

Speaking about all of those critical thinking, creativity and self-management skills that are fundamental to learning here at IST and to the future of learning and work, kudos and congratulations to our Grade 10 students on their MYP Personal Project Exhibition held at school this past week. Each of the IB programmes includes a culminating project (Grade 5 PYP Exhibition, Grade 10 MYP Personal Project, and Grade 12 IB Diploma Extended Essay), with Wednesday's MYP PP Exhibition showcasing a delightful assortment of independent, student initiated personal passion projects. The students did an excellent job presenting their research process and products to community members, with areas of interest including 'Intelligent Garbage Sorting', 'Trauma and PTSD', 'Al and the Global Economy', 'Health Care APP – Mindful Me', and 'Surrealism in the Environment'. And don't forget that the PYP Exhibition is coming up soon too, on March 13!

A reminder to our community that **IST supports the annual Pink Ribbon Day**, with its commitment to supporting breast cancer research and treatment. Show your support by dressing your children in pink (and yourselves!) and by joining **our Pink Parade walk around the school track at 12:25PM this coming Wednesday**. Who knows, you might see Mr. Conway and Mr. Wallace in pink tutus or ribbons!

Finally, another reminder that **Season 2 of CCAs ends today**. There will be no general CCAs next week, and **Season 3** starts on Monday 11 March.

Happy Birthday, Ms. Park!


