Dear Parents

As you know we have had an incredibly busy week here at school with representatives from two of our accreditation agencies (CIS and WASC) visiting to validate our self-study report and the numerous standards that are used to rate the quality of international schools. We won't receive the full written report for another six weeks or so, but the team did share some general findings with our leadership team yesterday just prior to their departure. A few of the key findings included:

- Ours perhaps was the best prepared and organized visit and report that either of the visitors has seen!
- We are well ahead in our work towards the next stage of the new 'Pathway 2' accreditation protocol and process (visit in May 2025), much furter than any other school so far;
- The school easily meets or exceeds all standards;
- We have a magnificent campus (and so clean and green!);
- Our programmes are very well developed and, in many instances, cutting edge;
- Both our staff and our parents are highly engaged and committed;
- We have amazing students who exude authentic pride in their school and the opportunities it affords them;
- AND, they asked the question: "Why are some heritage families leaving IST to go to the USA or England ... don't they realise IST is better (they really did say that, and I agree ... never too late to change one's mind!)"

I want to thank all the staff, students and parents who committed time this week to meet with our visitors and to share thoughts and feelings with them about our school. We really do have a school and community that we can feel justly proud of!

Our Grade 12 students continue to work their way through their final examinations (some even finished today) and I wanted to remind all parents that you are invited to attend the graduation ceremony at 4PM in the Han Theatre on Friday 24 May ... in just two weeks! Please do come along to celebrate the completion of their secondary studies, and please give them some final words of encouragement over the coming week as the later finishers complete their exams.

Every year as our school prepares to bid a fond farewell to our graduating Seniors, we like to recognise two individual students and to highlight their achievements in front of the entire school community by bestowing upon them the awards of Valedictorian and Salutatorian. Both honours share a special place of prominence in the school and are an integral part of our graduation traditions at IST and around the world.


Used Book Sale




